ARE YOU WILLING FOR HIS GLORY?

Genesis 22:1-2, 11-14

This account of Abraham and his relationship with God is powerful, as it demonstrates Abraham's obedience to God's command and what he was willing to do for God's glory. We are placed in various situations or go through storms that will test our obedience. If you tell God, "For your glory, I will do anything," you better believe your words will be tested (let that marinate).

From the text, it appears that Abraham did not question God's command or hesitate to fulfill the order. How many times have we received a command and questioned it? How many times have we received a command and hesitated in our action to fulfill the command? Better yet, how many times have we received a command and didn't do what we were told *at all*? Our faithfulness should drive our obedience to fulfill *any* command spoken into our lives by God.

Abraham's action shows a strong respect or reverence for God. It also shows that Abraham believed if he sacrificed his son for God, God could resurrect his son as a result of his obedience and faith (testing the tester). Let me throw this in; if God asks you to sacrifice something or someone, then do it with faith in knowing that He can resurrect the very thing He is asking you to sacrifice.

Remember, Job was blessed with more in his latter days than his former. As some like to say, Job was blessed with double for his trouble! Now ponder on this. It's ironic that we see a father willing to sacrifice his son in the Old Testament and our Father sacrifice His Son in the New Testament. From this, I would say that God would not ask us to do something that He is not willing to do Himself (my God, let that marinate for real)!

The beauty of Abraham's willingness to be obedient and sacrifice his son was not only acknowledged by God, but provision was made for the sacrifice: a ram in the bush. Abraham was willing to sacrifice his son, so what are you willing to sacrifice at God's command? The willingness to be obedient may come with a lack of understanding as to why He has asked you to do something.

You may not understand why He asked you to turn in your resigna-

tion. You may not understand why He asked you to pay your tithes with the last little bit of money in your account. You may not understand why He allowed you to endure heartache and pain. You may not understand why He allowed things and people to be taken from you.

When it is for His glory, we will not comprehend it. When it is for His glory, we will not be comfortable. When it is for His glory, we have to trust Him regardless. Through the hurt and pain, trust Him! Through the losses, trust Him! Through the disappointments, trust Him! Through it all, trust Him!

When we are going through a storm, He will provide! When we are standing in need, He will provide! Obedience, however, is the key! When we are obedient to His command, He will provide! Deuteronomy 28:1-14 speaks of the blessings we can receive through our obedience to God's command. He will make you the head and not the tail through your obedience! He will put you above and not beneath through your obedience! He will make you a lender and not a borrower through your obedience! In order to receive the blessings He has for us, we have to follow Abraham's example and be obedient to Him. Obedience will always produce a ram in the bush!

For His glory, are you willing to do anything? Think about it, pray about it, and let it marinate!

1 John 5:14-15

God wants to remind us that we should trust and believe in Him. Whatever we are going through *will* pass! Yes, you may be in the midst of a storm right now, but it *will* pass! Yes, you may be going through a hard-ship right now, but it *will* pass! Yes, you realth may be under attack, but it *will* pass! Yes, you may be at a breaking point, but it *will* pass! Yes, you may be on the verge of losing your job, but it *will* pass! Yes, you may be dealing with an attack on your home, but it *will* pass! Yes, your family may be under attack, but it *will* pass. You've been in a wilderness situation for a long time, but it *will* pass!

But if you believe, you *have* to trust Him! Job said, "Though He slay me, yet I will trust in Him" (Job 13:15). Job made another powerful statement that I would contend is overlooked. He said, "If a man dies, shall he live *again*? All the days of my hard service I will wait, Till my change comes" (Job 14:14).

Through your storm, you *have* to wait on Him! Through your pain, you *have* to wait on Him! The Word says, "Wait on the Lord; be of good courage, and He shall strengthen your heart; Wait, I say, on the Lord" (Ps. 27:14). You can't hurry God! You have to wait on Him! He wants you to wait on Him! Wait on God; it *will* come to pass!

Whatever you need, trust and believe in the Lord! It willcome to pass!

Job 1:8-12

Since He knows everything about us, then we should be still and let God be God!

I say limited harm because Satan could not kill Job. This should give you a new perspective on the Scripture, "No weapon formed against you shall prosper" (Is. 54:17). 1 Samuel 17:31-37

One day, I was reading the account of David and Goliath from the perspective of: speak to bring your "giant" down. After I completed the thought, I was guided back to what took place before Goliath was defeated. David left his duties of watching the flock to join the army in battle with the Philistines. If you notice, David was ready to fight, but Saul tried to disqualify him by saying that he was not able to fight because he was a youth and Goliath was a man.

Now, keep in mind that Saul was the king, and they (he and David) were on the same side or team. It is amazing how the ones who may try to disqualify you from doing something are the people who are in your corner (really let that marinate). I like to believe that they try to disqualify you from doing something because they have disqualified themselves from doing the very thing that you are courageous enough to do (help me, Holy Spirit. Let that marinate, too).

Here is the good news! Man cannot disqualify what God has already qualified. David's response to Saul explained why he was qualified to fight the Philistine. Man will try to disqualify you for not knowing the prerequisites you have completed that qualify you to do what God wants you to do. Don't forget, Saul was the current king, and David was the future, anointed king (read 1 Samuel 16:1-13). The future king brought down the "giant" of the current king; word to you, you may be qualified to take down the generational "giants" of those before you so those after you will not have to face them!

Again, man cannot disqualify what God has already qualified. You don't have to argue, defend, or debate someone when they say you are not qualified. They don't know the pre-work or basic training you have completed that qualifies you for your assignment. "Now to Him who is able to do exceedingly abundantly above all that we ask or think, according to the power that works in us" (Eph 3:20). You are able because *He* is able, and because *He* is able, *you* are *qualified*!!

KEEP P.U.S.H.ING

So you have been praying and feel that your prayers have gone unheard. You have been praying, but you haven't seen any actions as a result of your prayer. You are getting discouraged because you think God is not listening to you. Well, let me encourage you by saying God hears you! Our timing is not God's timing. When we want things to happen may not be God's time for them to happen! Don't think that just because you don't see any change in your situation that God is not listening. Check this out:

Then he said to me, "Do not fear, Daniel, for from the first day that you set your heart to understand, and to humble yourself before your God, your words were heard' and I have come because of your words. But the prince of the kingdom of Persia withstood me twenty-one days; and behold, Michael, one of the chief princes, came to help me, for I had been left alone there with the kings of Persia. Now I have come to make you understand what will happen to your people in the latter days, for the vision refers to many days yet to come" (Daniel 10:12-14).

See, Daniel was praying and fasting for *three weeks* (according to the Scripture); hence we have the phrase we use commonly today: "Daniel Fast." In Daniel's case, it wasn't that God didn't hear him; the delay was due to Gabriel being held up in battle (spiritual) and then receiving help from Michael (SN: God will *always* send help when you need it). Gabriel had to fight his way to get to Daniel to deliver the message.

Let me share something with you; you are *so* important that the Kingdom of Light and Kingdom of Darkness are fighting over you! In fighting over you, Satan will send out agents to stop you from receiving a word or blessing. But we all know that Satan can't win! We serve a *great* and *mighty* God! The battle is not ours but the Lord's, and because it is His battle, victory is ours!
